
Each student day will include synchronous learning sessions spread throughout the school day. These times are when children are engaged with the teacher in a whole class or small group learning session. To compliment these synchronous learning times students will also have asynchronous sessions to accompany the synchronous learning. These times in the schedule will allow children to try out learning that was taught, complete assigned work, and work on on going projects.



In addition to keeping our Burley vision at the forefront of our planning we are also aligning the Burley remote experience to Chicago Public School's final framework expectations. Some of the aspects that families should be aware of include the daily schedule and synchronous/asynchronous times of day. The school day will run on the daily schedule from 8:15 to 3:15.




To allow for lunchtime to be a shared time for families to spend together Burley will be implementing a school wide lunch hour from 11:30-12:30 each day. All students and staff will observe lunch at this time.





Greater simplicity and consistency

We used your feedback from the spring to design a full week of specials instruction. Specials classes for each homeroom will be the same hour of the day and be reached with the same Google meet link each day. The correct specials teacher will be in that meet each day. The first week of school contains 4 days and every student will meet each special teacher the first week of school. The following weeks students will have 2 weeks cycles with each specials area. For instance, a 1st grade student in 104 might have the introduction week the first week and then 2 weeks of Art, each day during their specials time they will receive live instruction for the first 30 minutes of the time block and work time with opportunities for feedback from specials teachers.



There will be scheduled time during the week where teachers will hold office hours to answer parent or student questions about remote learning expectations and assigned work.


A104 means homeroom 104. It does not indicate a pod assignment.
